



Players & Umpires Code of Conduct

PLAYER'S CODE OF CONDUCT

This code of conduct is supplied by the Andover & District Netball Association.

- 1) Know the rules of the game and play to them.
- 2) Play fairly, be competitive but not aggressive.
- 3) During play do not question a decision made by the Umpires either by gesture, look, verbally or by commenting to another player.
- 4) Give the ball promptly to opponents for throw-ins, penalty shots, free and penalty passes etc.
- 5) Ensure you are in the correct position indicated by the Umpire when penalties are set.
- 6) Keep yourself in control at all times and do not retaliate. Do not use obscene language at any time.
- 7) Accept victory modestly and defeat graciously. Your club will be judged on your behaviour.
- 8) Thank the umpires for officiating your match.
- 9) Enjoy your netball.

UMPIRE'S CODE OF CONDUCT

This code of conduct is supplied by the Andover & District Netball Association.

- 1) Comply with this code and such guidelines as may be issued from time to time by the Committee
- 2) Have a duty to exercise reasonable care and skill to enforce the rules of the game so as to ensure the safety of players.
- 3) At all times, umpire consistently, independently (an attitude of mind characterised by integrity) and with complete impartiality, respecting and abiding by the Rules which govern the game, in the true spirit of sportsmanship.
- 4) Conform to a standard of mental and physical fitness which enables you to effectively and efficiently control the matches to which you are appointed.
- 5) Maintain a complete knowledge and up-to-date interpretation of the Official Rules of Netball and be fully conversant with the Rules, Regulations and Scoring Systems applicable to the event at which you are officiating.
- 6) Be smartly dressed and appear on court in clothing that will project an image.
- 7) Remember you are the controller of the game and your decisions should not be influenced by spectators, Team officials or players.
- 8) Exercise self-control at all times and not commit to any action likely to bring the game into disrepute.
- 9) Not consume alcoholic drinks or smoke whilst officiating.
- 10) Not wager on or coach during any match or in a Tournament at which you are officiating as an umpire.
- 11) Be liable to Disciplinary Action if you have committed any breach of this Code of Conduct or have failed to comply with the Guidelines issued by the EN Umpiring Committee.
